EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 05, s.2021

RE-ORGANIZATION OF THE MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL (LPOC)

WHEREAS, Art. 186, Rules & Regulation implementing the Local Government Code of 1991 calls for the reorganization of the Municipal Peace & Order Council at all levels, the incumbent members of which is co-terminus with the previous administration.

NOW, THEREFORE, in compliance with the above article, I, **LEONARDO M. ROXAS**, *Municipal Mayor*, do hereby proclaim and order that:

Section 2. Duties and Functions — The MPOC shall formulate its action plan to be able to come up with the effective measures of implementing its functions;

1. Formulate plans recommended such measures which will improve or enhance peace and order and public safety in their respective areas of responsibility;
2. Monitor the implementation of Peace & Order, programs & projects at the provincial, city and municipal level and the operation of the Bantay Bayan and such other counter insurgency programs and activities;
3. Make periodic assessment of the prevailing Peace & Order situation in their respective areas of responsibility and submit report thereon with the recommendations to the Chairman of the National Peace & Order Council;
4. Receive complaints against government personnel, civilian or military, endorse the same to the agency concerned and demand/compel such agency to submit report of action taken thereon.


Section 3. Peace and Order Council Secretariat — There shall be a Peace and Order Council Secretariat which shall handle the administrative operational and technical activities of the Peace and Order Council that is organized in the various administrative levels of government. Specifically, the secretariat shall prepare plans and programs for the consideration of the councils; supervise, direct and monitor, for the council, implementation of approved policies, plans and programs; undertake liaisoning and coordination of activities with appropriate agencies of the government and provide a forum for inter-disciplinary dialogue and deliberation of major issues and problems affecting peace and order.

“At the municipal levels, the Secretariat of the MPOC shall be headed by the most senior DILG officer stationed in the municipality”.

Section 4. Meetings — That the MPOC shall meet once every six (6) months or as often as necessary.

Section 5. Effectivity — This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
